Dear Parents,

Flying High!!

On Monday 107 students along with teachers had their bags packed and with great excitement boarded the buses to set off on the 2019 school camp to Portsea. There were a few anxious and teary parents gathered to bid farewell to their children as they set off on a two night/three day adventure away from school and home.

Portsea Camp is a great place for the children to enjoy many new experiences, build relationships and lasting friendships and discover things about themselves and others. We were very impressed with the way children participated in the activities and as the opportunities presented they grew in confidence and courage. While some have had past experience at similar activities - for many this was all new. This time together helped them all to learn and develop important life skills.

The experiences were varied from boogie boarding, snorkeling or raft building to Flying high on the flying fox or even higher even to the STARS on the giant swing. We had group challenges to build a hut with tarps and ropes to withstand water and wind and build a bridge to cross a creek. To go high on the giant swing we needed to follow commands and work together to raise the child to the sky. There was the need to encourage and support. Clearly evident was the display of good manners and inclusivity.

The camp was action packed with walks to the Portsea pier, a camp fire and sharing of talents, time for a swim, a liturgy on the beach at twilight, a beach disco and a movie in our sleeping bags and PJs. The food was plentiful, nutritious and well received after the activities. The camp staff were very friendly and had plenty of contingency plans to cope with changes of weather and to ensure that everyone who wanted to, got to fly high on the giant swing.

This year the children also experienced tree surfing at the Enchanted Maze on their way back to school. We had a great camp and all returned safely back to school on Wednesday ready for a BIG sleep after our exciting adventure together.

Education in faith

'Do not be afraid... they left everything and followed him'. Luke 5: 1-11

The theme for yesterdays Gospel is is in a boat on a lake. It is a familiar setting for Peter. We hear that Peter has



been fishing all day with nothing to show for it. Jesus enters Peter's boat and asks him to throw the net into the lake once again. Peter listens to Jesus. They let down the net and what a catch they get! The miraculous catch of fish is Peter's encounter with the presence of God. This encounter is so powerful that Peter gets on his knees before Jesus. Jesus tells Peter, "Do not be afraid, from now on you will be catching people." Peter accepts Jesus' call to follow him. He leaves everything and follows Jesus.

Like the fishermen, Jesus calls us to discipleship in the ordinariness of our everyday lives. Rather than complain about the same routine, or the parts of our job (paid or unpaid) that irritate us, we will be happier and with lighter hearts if we search for God in the moment. When we recognise our ordinary lives as a response to God's love, the burdens will be less and our joy will be greater.

This week, ask each other to name one of your best friends and recall the moment you met each other. Share how that friend has been important in your life, where they have held you up, when you laugh or cry together. Have each person name one way his/her life is different because of this friend. Finally, make connections between these friendships and the friendship Jesus built with the disciples.


