Happy are the poor. Woe to the rich!' Luke 6: 17, 20–26

In this week's gospel Luke gives us his version of the "Beatitudes." Jesus preaches about the blessings that come from doing what is right and good. We call these blessings the Beatitudes. Jesus tells the disciples how "blessed" are the poor, the hungry, the sad, and the persecuted, for they will be rewarded in heaven. Jesus' sermon brings great hope to the poor and mistreated. They are promised happiness in the kingdom of heaven. The Beatitudes tell us about the happiness that God wants for every person.

Children trust their parents to take good care of them and give them direction. That's a lot of responsibility for a parent. Similarly, we all are challenged by these beatitudes to trust completely in God. When we trust and serve God, we know clearly from this reading that God will take care of us in the Kingdom.

This week, spend time reading the Beatitudes carefully again as a family. Suggest ways that people might be "poor" that don't relate to economic class. What ways can people be hungry and still have enough food to eat? What kind of sorrow would we experience without God in our lives? With a broader understanding of these terms, create a mobile or booklet where family members illustrate what the beatitudes mean for your family today. You might conclude by suggesting ways your family will practice living out the beatitudes you have illustrated.


Student Wellbeing and Performing Arts Lessons

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Before and After School Care

PLEASE BE ADVISED that that we have child ratios and a limited number of places for children who can attend each day. Educators work according to the number of children booked into care. It is therefore necessary for PAR-ENTS to book children, who are enrolled casually, into



care at least 24 hours in advance so staffing can be arranged as required.

ANY BOOKINGS made to our booking number (0411 295 273) received on the day will be subject to availability. Children booked on a permanent basis have priority.

IN THE EVENT of children arriving when we are fully booked, will be sent to the school office. We will inform parents that we are full and cannot accept the children.

DUE TO GOVERNMENT CHANGES in administration all children must be 24 hours in advance by completing the enrolment forms so as family details can be added to the computer system.

A NEW electronic Sign In /Out procedure which requires family, children and authorised nominees details to ensure the safety of your child/ren so they can only be picked up by those on your child's enrolment forms.

THANK YOU for your continued support and ask that you assist us by following the above procedures.

REMEMBER: Term Bookings are charged at a cheaper rate than Casual Care., both casual and booked care where children do not attend will be charged accordingly.
