

STATEMENT FROM ARCHBISHOP MARK COLERIDGE, PRESIDENT OF THE AUSTRALIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS CONFERENCE

The news of Cardinal George Pell's conviction on historical child sexual abuse charges has shocked many across Australia and around the world, including the Catholic Bishops of Australia.

The Bishops agree that everyone should be equal under the law, and we respect the Australian legal system. The same legal system that delivered the verdict will consider the appeal that the Cardinal's legal team has lodged. Our hope, at all times, is that through this process, justice will be served.

In the meantime, we pray for all those who have been abused and their loved ones, and we commit ourselves anew to doing everything possible to ensure that the Church is a safe place for all, especially the young and the vulnerable.

Beyou is a new national framework that promotes positive mental health. It is research and evidence based. The vision of **BeYou** is that every Australian school is a positive, inclusive and resilient community, where every child, young person, staff member and parent/carer can achieve their best possible mental health.

The most effective approach to mental health prevention and promotion is one that involves the whole learning community – including leaders, educators, children, young people and their families, and the wider local community.

This is what we call a 'whole learning community approach', and it involves working together with all members of your learning community to create change. It's about building a positive and inclusive environment which promotes resilience. We know this is important as good mental health enables positive learning to take place.

The **BeYou** is a resource staff will be using as a form of professional development. As a staff we have decided to focus on the module called "**Learning Resilience**". This fits in perfectly with the Resilience Project which we will be participating in, during Term 3. This is a school program that inspires learning communities to practise evidence based strategies, which build resilience and improve mental health. Through this program, we will be inspired to practise the evidence based strategies that build resilience and improve mental health.

There are other resources we have access to through the **BeYou** including up to date fact sheets around mental health. We will share some of these through the school newsletter. Let's work together to foster an attitude where we value mental health and we are proactive in teaching strategies to help us achieve this.

How are nutrition and mental health linked?

Healthy eating helps children and young people feel better about themselves and their bodies, cope more effectively with stress, better manage their emotions and get a good sleep – all of which assist learning.

In contrast, poor nutrition has been linked to emotional and behavioural problems and increased learning difficulties.

Most research about nutrition and mental health has focused on adults. Researchers have found that good nutrition is associated with better mental health outcomes, whereas a poor diet is associated with a greater risk of depression and anxiety.

Emerging research that focuses on children and young people has also found a relationship between unhealthy diets and poorer mental health outcomes. There is a link between externalising behaviour (such as hyperactivity, aggression, disobedience) and diet.

For example, poor nutrition has been associated with symptoms of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder. Poor nutrition also affects concentration and increases tiredness, which then interferes with learning. Children and young people's behaviour, and their academic performance improves when good quality food is eaten.

Dietary habits aren't always a choice

'Food insecurity' – where people don't have enough food due to things such as unemployment and poverty – is also a problem for many families in Australia. Food insecurity can result in poorer academic performance, time off from school, stress, depression, anxiety, aggression, and difficulty getting along with others.

Before and After School Care

PLEASE BE ADVISED that that we have child ratios and a limited number of places for children who can attend each day. Educators work according to the number of children booked into care. It is therefore necessary for PARENTS to



book children, who are enrolled casually, into care at least 24 hours in advance so staffing can be arranged as required.

ANY BOOKINGS made to our booking number (0411 295 273) received on the day will be subject to availability. Children booked on a permanent basis have priority.

IN THE EVENT of children arriving when we are fully booked, will be sent to the school office. We will inform parents that we are full and cannot accept the children.

DUE TO GOVERNMENT CHANGES in administration all children must be 24 hours in advance by completing the enrolment forms so as family details can be added to the computer system.

A NEW electronic Sign In /Out procedure which requires family, children and authorised nominees details to ensure the safety of your child/ren so they can only be picked up by those on your child's enrolment forms.

REMEMBER: Term Bookings are charged at a cheaper rate than Casual Care., both casual and booked care where children do not attend will be charged accordingly.




