Education in faith

"Alleluia, Alleluia, give thanks for the risen Lord, Alleluia, Alleluia, give praise to His name."

Welcome back to this second term as we joyfully celebrate this Easter Season. We began this new term with a focus on the Easter story and the centrality of the Easter event for all who name themselves as Christian. This is who we are; each week as we proclaim our Creed we affirm our belief in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We are an Easter people who live in the joy and hope of the promise of a new resurrected life with the Lord.

On Friday afternoon when Jesus died, the women had not been able to

finish the customary preparation for burial. The Sabbath began at sundown on Friday, so Mary of Magdala hurried to the tomb Sunday morning to complete her task. She found the tomb empty. Certain that Jesus' body had been stolen, she ran back to get the other disciples. Peter and the other disciple also found an empty tomb but with Jesus' clothing rolled neatly and placed where his body had been. The disciples still didn't understand about the resurrection and Mary wept. As she cried, two angels appeared asking why she was crying. She then saw a gardener and asked him where the body might be. When he called her by name, Mary immediately recognized Jesus.

Most parents have discovered by now that things aren't always as they seem. A poured out bottle of laundry detergent wasn't really mischievous behavior, but rather an attempt to surprise you with a generous gift of service.

Or secret whispers are not an attempt to hide some wrongdoing but rather an effort to plan a surprise for you. Things weren't as they seemed to Mary Magdalene either that first Easter morning. Our errors in perception often work to remind us that God's plan is not always obvious, but that we are challenged to trust in the promise of the resurrection.

This week, place symbols of Easter such as lighted candles, eggs, and lilies on your dinner table. Discuss how these items might have become symbols for Easter. What do they suggest to us about the gospel story we heard? How can we be symbols of the Easter message to each other and those outside our family?

CSEF - Camp, Sports and Excursion Fund Do you have one of these cards?

If you do, you may be eligible for \$125 for each of your children from the government to go towards your camp fees, swimming fees or excursion fees.

It's easy—just fill out the CSEF form available from the school office and present your current Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card and we will do the rest for you. Applications should be completed and lodged with us as soon as possible in term 1. This allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

BeYou Fact Sheet

AS SFS we are a BeYou school, where we value the

mental health of our whole school community, students, teachers, parents and families. This week's fact sheet is all about developing good decision making skills in our children.

How do decision making skills develop?

Children and young people's decision-making is strongly influenced by the expectations and values they learn from those around them.

This occurs when they:

- observe others (particularly those close to them)
- hear about and discuss values

have opportunities to make choices and experience their consequences.

Young children regularly choose how they'll behave, which toys or games they'd like to play with, which books they would like to read, or which television shows they want to watch. As they get older, children make bigger decisions that often involve their family, friends and schoolwork. The kinds of choices children and young people make affect their wellbeing, relationships and success.

Young children have some skills for making decisions, but they don't yet have the experience to understand complex adult situations. As their brain grows, a child is more able to hold things in their mind and remember what they've learned. They also improve the way they manage their thinking and feelings, control impulsive behaviour, think about time and plan ahead, and evaluate long-term versus short-term goals. SEASONS for growth

Seasons for Growth is a program to help children deal with change and loss.

Change and loss are issues that affect all of us at some stage in our lives.

At St Francis De Sales Primary School we recognize that students and families experience changes in their lives because of a death, loss of a pet, separation, divorce, or another significant loss.



We believe young people may benefit from learning how to manage these changes effectively.

If your child is struggling through a painful experience due to loss or significant change, this will be an opportunity for him/her to be supported and have the chance to explore his/her thoughts and feelings and to ask questions. Please note that this is not a clinical program and as such, no observation notes are taken or records kept. Due to the nature of the program, it relies heavily on the confidentiality of all participants.

It is anticipated, the 9 week program will begin in the middle of Term 2 and conclude in the middle of Term 3.

Sessions will take place within the school program at a suitable time. If you have any queries or concerns about the 'Seasons for Growth' program, please feel welcome to speak to me. Please discuss this matter with your child as he/she must be willing to participate in the program. If you think your child will benefit from this program, could you please let your child's home group teacher know or speak to me. You can email me on <u>rlenko@sfslynbrook.catholic.edu.au</u>. A consent form will go home shortly to give permission for your child to be a part of the program.
