This semester we are pleased to announce that you will be receiving your child's semester report online via the nForma Parent Portal for the first time on **Friday**, **June 21st 2019**.

Instructions on how to access the nForma Parent Portal will be sent out to the email addresses that have been previously supplied to the school. These emails will be sent out Friday, June 14th 2019. It is very important that you have updated your email addresses with the school, as an automated email containing instructions and login details will come from noreply@nforma.com.au and not the school. Please ensure that you check your junk/spam folder for an email from that address.

It is highly recommended that you use a computer to access your child's reports for the first time. Subsequent logins can be made on a mobile device if preferred. Once you have followed the instructions, you will be able to view your child's report online.

Once in the portal you will need to:

choose your child (if you have more than one at our school) and then choose 'Assessment and Reporting'. Then select the year/semester.

Catholic Education Melbourne School Improvement Surveys (CEMSIS): 2-20 September 2019

Throughout each year, we pause to listen to our students, families and staff to gauge how our learning community is travelling. This feedback is invaluable to our progress as effective school communities and is backed by evidence-based research and best practices.

One of the more important formal ways we engage and gather data is through **CEMSIS**, the Catholic Education Melbourne School Improvement Surveys.

CEMSIS is a set of surveys that have been built specifically for Catholic Schools in Melbourne by Learning Services teams at Catholic Education Melbourne in partnership with researchers at Learning First and in wide consultation with Principals in our schools.

In 2019, students, families and staff are invited to participate in CEMSIS using our brand new, secure and purpose-built online platform. The online platform is where our school leaders will access the summary reports that visualise the results of the student, family and staff surveys.

The CEMSIS survey platform is operated by an independent supplier, ORIMA Research Pty Ltd. The platform meets with the very high security and privacy standards for handling student and school data. In preparation for our participation we have updated our privacy policy to ensure our school community is fully informed and protected. Students at our school will be provided with supervised sessions where teachers are on hand to help and answer any questions. Families and staff can complete the survey anytime over the three-week window via an emailed link and password.

Feedback from last year's pilot trials indicate many surveys were done across a range of mobile devices and different web browsers. Schools will be providing more information about CEMSIS throughout Term 2 and 3 via newsletters and social media.

Our community's opinions are critical to understanding how our school is performing – CEMSIS is a key data source for guiding the ongoing work to improve our school.

All participation is invited, welcomed and 100% voluntary. The surveys are not a test; they are an inclusive way to feed the work we are already doing to improve our school. Everyone has the right to refuse to participate, or withdraw from the survey at any point before, during, or after completion of the survey. Please notify the school if your child does not wish to participate.

John 14: 15–16, 23–26

Because they still did not understand all that Jesus had told them, the disciples were huddled together, frightened, in a room. The doors locked, notwithstanding, Jesus entered the room and greeted the disciples with a sign of peace. Some have interpreted this sign of peace as more than the all be well with you, variety but more of the shalom type which entails a perfect harmony with God. In any case, the disciples received the Holy Spirit and came to understand the peace Jesus intended. The authority and power to forgive sins was also given to the Church at that time.

Children often come to parents frightened about one thing or another. It is a parent's job to calm their fears and generally parents do a pretty good job. But sometimes, a parent's doubts or concerns are the same as their chil-

dren's. When this happens, parents are not always sure how to answer them and after reading Sunday's Gospel we may think that our faith is not strong enough. But doubt does not necessarily mean a lack of faith. Sometimes the best thing parents can do is tell their children they wonder about the same things their children do and then together think about how our faith helps us answer the concern. Generally, these conversations revolve around a serious illness or death in the family and what happens when we die. It's not lack of faith that causes us to not know. It is a lack of knowledge, because it's true, none of us knows exactly.

Since this Gospel passage reminds us that the Church received the power to forgive our poor choices, this might be a good time to talk about reconciliation as a family and how receiving forgiveness from one another or through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, helps us heal and grow. If your family did not receive the sacrament during Lent, this might be a good time to go as a family

This week's fact sheet continues to build on our understanding of resilience and why it is important and how it develops.

How does resilience develop?

Resilience is best understood on a continuum

It develops and changes over time as children and young people grow and progress through developmental stages. People may have more, or less, resilience to draw on at any given time depending on their circumstances.

Biological influences

To some extent, resilience has a genetic component (that is, it lies within a person's individual makeup and personal strengths). However, it's not simply an individual characteristic nor is it a fixed character trait.

Student Well-Being

Encompassing: Student Engagement, Student Connectedness, Classroom Climate, Inclusion and Prevention to Intervention.

A combination of individual, family, community and societal factors influence children and young people's developing resilience. This can include:

Exposure to manageable stress

Children and young people develop coping skills through exposure to manageable stress in their dayto-day lives (for example, the everyday stress of getting ready for their early learning service or school).

For infants and very young children, days are full of new, sometimes stressful, situations. Even the routine of nappy changes can be stressful when it's new. For older babies and young children, everyday stresses include meeting new people or being separated from families while in their early learning service.

For older children, being uncertain of rules or expectations at school can lead to stress. For adolescents, not knowing where to turn for support, or to have questions answered, can be stressful.

When educators respond in a warm and sensitive manner, children and young people learn they are safe, that their needs will be taken care of and they'll be supported with their coping skills.

Positive relationships

Strong relationships within immediate and extended family helps at times of stress or adversity.

This support and security is a critical buffer against life's ups and downs – it's often called a protective factor for mental health.

Connection to diverse groups of friends is also valuable

Even very young children develop a sense of self and self-

confidence through their peer relationships and attribute meaning and value to them. Relationships outside of the family mean children and young people have someone else to support them when times get tough.

Significant adults

Research indicates a positive relationship with at least one caring, competent adult outside of the child or young person's immediate family is related to greater mental health and resilience. Positive relationships are particularly important for individuals who've not experienced close relationships with their family and can improve developmental outcomes.
