Parents are reminded that as advertised there are only three tickets permitted for each family so that all families can attend the concert. We are able to cross check ticket purchases against families. We hope there will be sufficient seats but if there is an issue we will need to refund ticket cost to families who have gone over the limit and release the tickets they have purchased. We ask that families do help ensure that every family gets the opportunity to buy tickets. We will be doing this cross check if required before open release of tickets which is due on the 26 August.

'I have come not to give peace, but discord'.

Luke 12: 49-53

As Jesus announced his mission, he made it clear that there would be no compromising. Called to repentance and challenged to be ready, discipleship would most likely divide households and communities. He knew already that there were divisions among the Jewish leaders. He warned his followers that they, too, might face divisions among their own families. While these repercussions would cause pain, it would also mark the coming of God's Kingdom.

Sometimes we have to take an unpopular stand against the ideas of others. When we say "no" to someone who wants to hear "yes," division is created. Parents make decisions that serve a purpose and guide the formation of their children. Friends may say "no" to each other creating division. Of

course, healing and reconciliation are vital to the growth of all relationships; and this is basically the same concept as this week's Gospel. There will be hard and unpopular acts associated with following Jesus. As a loving parent, God won't compromise the plan. As loving family members, we also understand God's motive!

Find a family movie that illustrates this Gospel message: Doing something that's right even though it's difficult and

sometimes unpopular. One possibility is from the Lion King when Simba decides to return home. Share your ideas about what was hard for Simba in his decision.

Who helped him?

Who suffered because of his decision?

Who benefited?

What divisions were evident and what reconciliations took place?

Think about ways our own lives are like this and share your ideas with one another.

BeYou is a resource and framework which provides educators with knowledge, resources and strategies for helping children achieve their best possible mental health. At SFS, we are a very multi-cultural school, which makes our school unique and special. This week's fact sheet from the BeYou website is all about blended families.

What is a blended family?

A family can be made up of anyone a person considers to be their family

A blended family is where separate families come together to form a new family. There is no single way to describe blended families - family members may not be biologically related or live with the child or young person all the time. Some children or young people may have one or several parents or carers, including grandparents, step-parents, same-sex parents, aunts and uncles, foster parents or adoptive parents.

As an educator, you'll meet and interact with families of all shapes and sizes.

Many children and young people in your care will be living in blended families. These families may have to consider more complex circumstances when trying to build healthy relationships. For example:

• children and young people may feel their prior relationships have changed because of the new couple relationship and new relationships with step-children

• family members may still be grieving the loss of their original family

children and young people may spend time with two families who have different expectations of them.

These factors may be stressful for children and young people, and, as a result, there may be a long period of adjustment for families.
