## **From the Principal**

### Aiming HIGH – Reaching for the STARS!

## What does it mean to aim high and reach for the stars? Is this in fact possible!!!

In education terms a school can certainly be aiming high and can actually be named as high achieving. This becomes a reality when the mean data for a curriculum area shows above the average result. In addition the effect size which is the amount of growth since the last time the data was collected shows above the average effect or growth in that time period. Using these two measures the Catholic Education Office provides us with where we are placed on a scale using our NAPLAN data. The data that we are particularly interested in is the two year growth for a cohort of students. As the NAPLAN tests occur at Yr 3, Yr 5, Yr 7 and Yr 9, we are primarily interested in the two year growth between Yr 3 and Yr 5 and the two year growth between Yr 5 and Yr 7. The Yr 5 to Yr 7 data particularly tells us how we prepare our students for secondary school and beyond. It tells us how we are going in the senior grades. While the Yr 3 to 5 data points to how well we are going in the junior years.

School data can fall into four areas:

- High achieving Higher than the mean score and high effect/growth over the two years.
- Growth Lower than the mean score but High effect/growth over the two years.
- Cruising Higher than the mean score but low effect/growth over the two years.
- Needing intervention Lower than the mean and low effect/growth over the two years.

## **From the Principal**

We are delighted by our data:

The data is testament to the differentiated program we offer that ensures we match the curriculum to the child's readiness for the next challenge. Overall we get all our children moving along the continuum of learning. We certainly prepare our children well for secondary education with a solid foundation to launch from.

Our student data continues to be strong and our 2019 NAPLAN results shows that our students grow and consolidate their learning as they move across the school. In particular the data of our students who move to secondary schools reveals that children from SFS go on to be high achieving students with a growth or effect size that is often higher than the mean of other schools. Our data, particularly our two year growth data, from Yr 3 to Yr 5 and from Yr 5 to Yr 7 reveals we are a high performing school in Writing and Spelling in particular. Our students continue to improve with reading as they go through the school from Primary to Secondary. We are getting great growth in Numeracy. Our Grammar results for 2019 seems to be at odds with results from previous years. We are delighted to see that as students move on to senior primary years and into secondary these results improve in grammar and in fact become high achieving as well.

It is always important that we continue to review and enhance our learning & teaching strategies so that we are innovative and empower our students. Data affirms where we are and what we are doing but it also gives us areas to work on and improve. While we are delighted with our writing and spelling results we will be targeting grammar through focus lessons. We will have a focus in 2020 on Numeracy in our junior grades. We aim to engage our junior staff in a Numeracy Project. In these years it is important not to move to abstract algorithms too early. Young children need to have a strong understanding of number and develop good visualisation and mental computation strategies. Research reveals that rote learning of facts and steps without proper understanding can hamper the development of mathematical competencies as the child moves to senior grades and into secondary school. In the senior years we will target Literacy in 2020 while maintaining our strong Numeracy teaching and Learning strategies.

SFS is certainly aiming HIGH!! Let's work together to support our students to reach for the STARS! Congratulations to our students and teachers.

### Luke 23: 35–43

Associated with Jesus' passion, this coming week's Gospel brings us to the scene of the crucifixion. Jesus, on his own cross, is flanked by thieves on either side. One of the thieves jeers and taunts Jesus calling him a king and wondering why a king cannot save himself and them as well. Jesus responds telling the thief that his royalty is not like that of earthly kingdoms. He has no material wealth or armies. The second thief asks Jesus to remember him when he comes into his kingdom. We know today that he is with Jesus in heaven.

Today's children are not considered outcasts, but if you ask most children, they'll tell you they don't think adults really value their opinion. Jesus always reached out to the people that society generally found unimportant and that is a good thing for us to remember as parents. Even while he hung on the cross, Jesus preached the Good News to the criminals hanging with him. Sometimes we find ourselves living, witnessing, and teaching the Gospel message to our children even when the majority view is different. Jesus' words in this week's Gospel give us the courage to share our faith with our children even when society doesn't count their input for much and even when the Gospel message is not the majority viewpoint.

This week, share ideas with one another about what a king is. What does a king do? What might his responsibilities be? How would a king care for his people? Consider the ideas shared by your family and see how they fit the image of Jesus as King. How are they different?

#### BeYou

BeYou is a framework for educators to use to help promote positive mental health. This week's fact sheet from the **BeYou** website is all about transitioning. It is such a busy time of the year and many of our children are looking ahead to next year with either starting secondary school or moving from kinder to Foundation at school. It is a very exciting time but it can also be very difficult for some children.

### Transitions are defined quite simply as change

They are a period where we must adapt to new circumstances, expectations, people, environments or routines. Whether big or small, transitions are a significant part in children and young people's lives, as well as the learning community.

Children and young people may also experience transitions in their home life – for example, moving house, going on holiday, the birth of a sibling, family separations and bereavements.

### Transition is not just about the first day – it's a process that happens over time.

It begins as families and educational settings start to prepare during the previous year, or even earlier. It continues as children and young people experience their first days, weeks and months in their new environment.

Transition from home and between education settings involves various key changes for children, young people and families, including:

• the physical environment (for example, the size of the outdoor areas, buildings, the location and types of toilets, the number of other children, young people and educators)

• rules and procedures (for example, more structured times for attending class, eating and going to the toilet, rules for different places and times such as the classroom and recess)

• relationships (for example, meeting new children, young people and adults, responding to students of different ages, leaving established relationships with educators, getting to know a range of educators for different subjects)

• learning (for example, more formal learning experiences, structured times and set tasks, increasing independence and responsibility).


#### **Seasons for Growth**

What does it do? Seasons for Growth aims to strengthen the social and emotional wellbeing of children and young people who are dealing with significant life changes by: • Exploring the impact of the change and loss on everyday life • Learning new ways to respond to these changes **Who is it for?** Anyone who is living with the effects of change and loss. Many factors can cause change such as: • Friends can come and go • Loss of someone or something you love • Parents and families separate • Moving to a new place • Impact of

illness • Family work-life changes Change affects everyone differently, as does grief. It's the impact of the change, not the event itself that Seasons for Growth focuses on. We suggest that anyone affected by be-reavement wait 6-12 months before participating in a Seasons for Growth program.

I will be retraining as a Season's for growth companion next week, and we will be offering the program to children in term 1 next year. Please contact me at school <u>rlenko@sfslynbrook.catholic.edu.au</u> if you feel that your child would benefit from being involved in this program.
