'Are you the one who is to come, or must we wait for someone else?'

Matthew 11: 2-11

John the Baptist had disciples of his own and while in prison he sent some of them to Jesus. At John's request, the disciples asked Jesus if he was the Messiah or were they to wait for another. Jesus did not answer them directly, but pointed to the miracles he had performed in the name of God's love. If John himself did not wonder, it was likely that his followers did. Jesus did not fit the image of "Messiah," and so it was possible that people began to doubt their original perception.

It would have appeared to Jesus that John began to doubt. Perhaps it was the confinement of prison that let his mind question what he once so clearly understood. But even so, Jesus affirmed John in this scripture as the greatest of all prophets. From this experience, it is reassuring as parents to know that even when we doubt, either ourselves or God, we are still great in God's eyes. Our strength is in knowing God is with us as a loving parent.

This week is the day we light the third candle on our Advent wreath, the pink one! Pink represents joy, and our families should come to know that it is with joy we await the return of Jesus. Ask each member of the family how he/she will bring joy to someone's life this week.

International Human Rights Day

On **Tuesday 10th December** it was Human Right's day. Many of the children were intrigued as we had some orange balloons, streamers and table cloths around the school. Many teachers also wore orange clothing. We had a focus on Human Right's day at morning gathering and the children watched a short clip about the rights of children. **Human Rights Day** is observed by the international community every year on 10 December. It commemorates the **day** in 1948 the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of **Human Rights Orange is the colour used to represent the day.** The colour **orange** symbolizes a brighter future, free of violence.

BeYou is a framework for educators to help them to build mentally healthy learning communities. This week's fact sheet from the **BeYou** website is on Healthy Families.

Healthy families

What do these look like?

In healthy family relationships, people trust and rely on each other for support, love, affection and warmth. Families often share common goals and work together to reach those goals (for example, children and young people may help their families get the dinner dishes done so that everyone can relax).

Family members feel safe and connected to one another. Sometimes these relationships involve conflict, which is a normal part of family life. Conflict can occur between adults, children and young people. In healthy relationships, these conflicts are dealt with in a safe and respectful way.

Healthy family relationships mean that positive interactions outnumber the difficult times. Adults experiencing difficult life situations can provide learning opportunities in teaching and modelling coping strategies – children and young people shouldn't be burdened with stress, but it's helpful for them to see families successfully managing it with positive coping strategies.



Student Well-Being

Encompassing: Student Engagement, Student Connectedness, Classroom Climate, Inclusion and Prevention to Intervention.

The key qualities of a strong family unit identified by Australians in the Family Strengths Research Project were:

- **communication** – listening to each other and communicating with openness and honesty
- **togetherness** – sharing similar values and beliefs that create a sense of belonging and bonding
- **sharing activities** – spending time together doing things they enjoy
(for example, sports, reading, camping or playing games)
- **affection** – showing affection and care regularly through words, hugs, kisses and thoughtfulness
- **support** – offering and asking for support, with family members knowing they will receive help, encouragement and reassurance from one another
- **acceptance** – understanding, respecting and appreciating each family member's unique qualities
- **commitment** – seeing family wellbeing as a first priority and acting accordingly with commitment and loyalty
- **resilience** – being able to tolerate difficulties and adapt to changing situations in positive ways.

The biggest challenges in family relationships were highlighted as communication breakdown, parenting issues and difficult relationship dynamics.

Risk factors in families

There are many reasons why some individuals are more vulnerable than others to developing behavioural difficulties and mental health issues. Risk factors for children and young people are things that increase the likelihood of mental health issues developing.

Risk factors within the family include:

- family conflict, instability or separation
- lack of involvement with children and young people, or inconsistent parenting
- family violence, child abuse or neglect
- mental health issues or substance abuse
- a serious illness or disability

financial difficulties.

Protective factors in families

Protective factors decrease the chance of an individual experiencing mental health issues. These are related to good outcomes for children and young people, and serve to protect them if they're exposed to risk.

Protective factors within the family include:

- strong and stable family relationships – for example, consistent, caring relationships
- supportive parenting – for example, being available to listen to and talk with children and young people
- strong family values for example, a shared understanding of how to treat others
- consistency in routines and limits – for example, responding the same way to children or young people's behaviour.

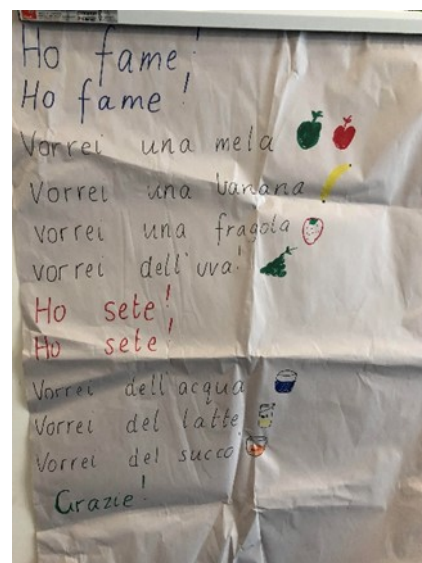
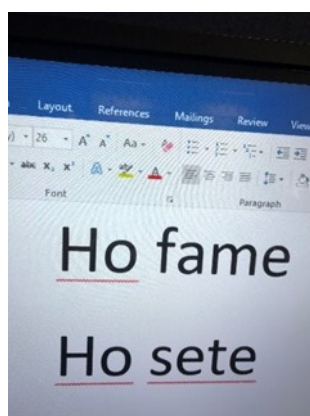
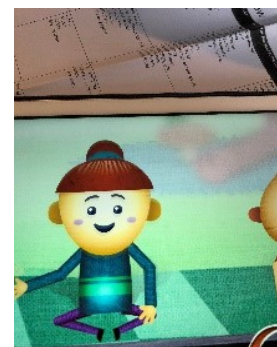

ELLA –Early Learning Languages Australia.

It has been a wonderful year of learning for our Junior students as they used technology as a tool to assist them with learning Italian as they completed Year 1 of a three year trial program. This term's APP focussed on vocabulary associated with food and drink. Asking and answering questions related to what food and drink they wanted as well as what food and drink they like and dislike. The program enabled students to act out real life situations using the vocabulary and phrases learnt in exploring the apps. This week our Foundation students have received a certificate for participation in the Program. All our Junior students used the Program. As part of the first year of the program only the data from our Foundation students usage has been collected for the trial, therefore only Foundation students have received certificates this year. By the end of 2021 all junior students will receive a certificate for being part of the Program.

pensi sempre per tutti (always think of others)

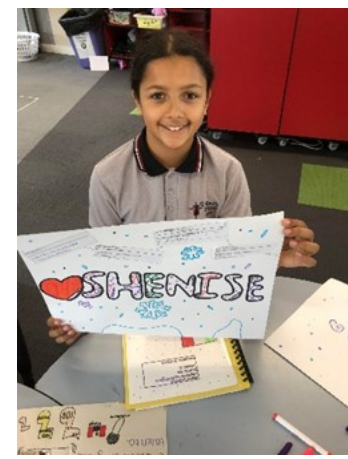
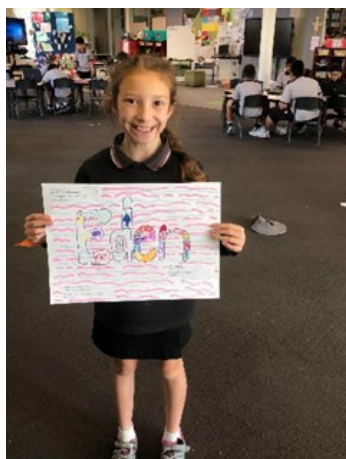
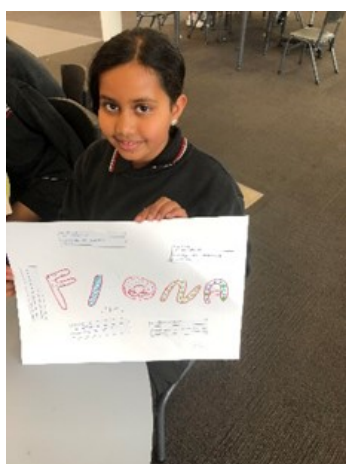
